## **Youth Confirmation Class 2023-24**

Calling all current 8th-11th graders and their parents/guardians! Next school year, a confirmation class will be offered for high school students. Confirmation is a unique Rite, and the decision to be confirmed is no small thing (which is why we will have a year-long process to help you, called Youth Confirmation Class). Regardless of how you feel about it, mark your calendar for Sunday, March 26 at 7:00 PM for a Google Meet to discuss what confirmation is and to begin thinking about if you'll want to participate in Youth Confirmation Class next year. In this meeting, Sara will share their confirmation story and how, after that, they still managed to end up a priest - even if you don't have any interest in Confirmation, this is a story you won't want to miss! ## Lent and Easter 2023

#### Lent-at-Home Bags

Sara and Molly have assembled Lent-at-Home bags that are available in the entryway of the Worship Entrance during Lent. They are designed to be ONE bag per family unit. The materials in these bags are from Illustrated Ministry, an overall phenomenal resource for Christian life. The Lenten theme this year is "This is My Body" and it's that theme of embodiment that you'll see come through in all of our Lenten offerings at St. Francis this year.

### Change for Change

This year's Easter egg hunt will look a little different from the standard one, wherein plastic eggs are filled with candy for kids to find and enjoy. This year, we're going to try something that Sara learned in seminary. All of those plastic eggs will be filled with coins (that's where you come in!) and children will get to donate those coins to one of three local organizations (that the youth group picked out - more information on those later) and receive a goodie bag to take home. The purpose of this model of Easter egg hunt is to embody the theology that is offered to us in Christ's resurrection, which is the promise of new life and new hope. By offering the found coins to a local organization that helps our community, children will learn they are part of a community that is offering new life and new hope to its neighbors. You can help us do this by collecting and bringing in all your coins this Lent! A container for donated coins will be available at church through Palm Sunday.

## The Future of Children's Chapel

The feedback Sara has gotten thus far is that Children's Chapel having some age appropriate formation for children during the sermon and part of the service on Sunday mornings - has been very positive. For this ministry to continue (and for others like it to develop), we need adult volunteers who are willing to assist with (or even potentially lead!) formation activities for children. For adults to be eligible to be that volunteer, they need to be trained in the Safe Church, Safe Communities curriculum with Sara. If you are interested in being an adult volunteer with children at St. Francis, please sign up for one of those trainings by contacting Sara to access the Sign Up Genius, which will be available in early/mid-March.
